Goods Movement Action Plan Phase 1 Report

Concept:

A goods movement plan that integrates needed infrastructure capacity expansion, public health and environmental impact mitigation, community impact mitigation and workforce development, and security and public safety enhancements.

Background

- Much work at local, regional and state levels
- December 2004 Administration creates Cabinet Goods Movement Working Group [Chairs: Secretaries Lloyd and McPeak]

Background

- * January 27, 2005 Joint Cal/EPA and BT&H Policy Statement Issued:
 - (...) The State's economy and quality of life depend upon the efficient, safe delivery of goods to and from our ports and borders. At the same time, the environmental impacts from goods movement activities must be reduced to ensure protection of public health. (...)





Phase 1 Report Key Preliminary Findings Regarding Air Pollution (9/05)

1) Current emissions from goods movement related activities are already a significant contributor to air pollution.

Phase 1 Report Key Preliminary Findings Regarding Air Pollution (9/05)

2) Future emissions from goods movement are expected to increase unless aggressive actions are taken to turn that trend around.

Phase 1 Report Key Preliminary Findings Regarding Air Pollution (9/05)

3) The health effects that are of concern include both cancer risk and non-cancer respiratory and cardiovascular effects.

Phase 1 Report Key Preliminary Findings Regarding Air Pollution (9/05)

4) The public health impacts from portrelated emissions are high and should be abated as quickly as possible.

Phase 1 Report Key Preliminary Findings Regarding Air Pollution (9/05)

5) The initial estimate for cost of airemission mitigation was \$2.0 to \$5.0 billion. [Updated draft estimate is \$2.8 to \$5.6 billion.]

Phase 1 Report Air Quality Goals


- By 2010, reduce emissions to 2001 levels
- Continue reducing emissions until air quality standards are met and community impacts are mitigated
- By 2020, cut health risk posed diesel PM emissions by 85%

Community Impacts

- Phase I report notes that communities adjacent to goods movement operations experience other impacts such as traffic, noise and light.
- Recommendations are needed as to mitigation and how to provide job opportunities for areas residents.

Draft ARB Emission Reduction Plan

- * Statewide health assessment
- * Strategies to achieve:
 - 2010 emissions 20% below 2001 levels
 - South Coast SIP targets for NOx met
 - Diesel PM risk cut two-thirds by 2020
- Includes various types of measures for achieving the emission reductions
