- The California Trucking Association (CTA) represents over 3,600 member companies.
- CTA members range from large trucking companies to single truck operators.
- CTA began in 1934 and has always promoted a safe and efficient goods movement system in California and throughout the country.



- The trucking industry in California represents \$40 billion a year in annual salaries.
- One out of every twelve Californians are employed in a trucking related job.
- Over one-million people go to work in the trucking industry everyday in California.



- Trucks exclusively serve all freight needs of nearly
 75 % of all California communities.
- Trucks carry close to 98 % of CA agricultural goods and almost 100 % of retail goods.
- Trucks are an integral part of the goods movement chain.



- California Trucking Association has been an active partner in efforts to reduce the emissions attributed to trucks involved in goods movement throughout the state.
- CTA has and will continue to support sustainable efforts to clean the air in California.



- The California Trucking Association supported the efforts of the California Air Resources Board in reducing emissions from Port Drayage Trucks.
- CTA developed a replacement strategy using several facets of the final adopted version of the ARB regulation.
- CTA continues to work with the ARB to reduce emissions from heavy duty trucks operating in California.



- CTA supported five minute idling limits in California.
- CTA sponsored legislation to reduce unnecessary idling at the ports.
- CTA has supported legislation to ban the registration of "gross polluting" engines made before 1994.
- CTA supported EPA and ARB clean engine standards.
- CTA is an active partner with the ARB in maintenance and enforcement of the Periodic Smoke Inspection Program.



- CTA has actively worked with local planning agencies to determine terminal access routes that least impact communities and best relieve congestion.
- CTA provides our member companies with comprehensive environmental compliance training and simultaneously maintains the largest Storm Water monitoring group in California.



- CTA members throughout California lead efforts to install software upgrades on trucks to reduce the amount of Oxides of Nitrogen (NOx) released during the combustion process.
- CTA member companies have been actively involved in local emission reduction programs throughout the state.
- CTA continues to work with the ARB during development and implementation of all regulations aimed at reducing emissions from trucks operating in California.
