



Zero Emissions Container Mover System Project (ZECMS) Request for Qualifications

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Objectives



- Transporting containers between marine container terminals at the ports and the ICTF
- Reducing environmental impacts (air quality, traffic congestion, noise, etc.)
- Maintaining or exceeding current cargo velocity and productivity
- Minimizing disruption to current port container terminal and ICTF operations
- Developing and implementing innovative technologies that meet these objectives

Joint ZECMS Management Team



- Port of Long Beach
- Port of Los Angeles
- Alameda Corridor Transportation Authority
- Other stakeholders to be consulted

RFQ Key Elements



- Minimum necessary qualifications for a wide range of zero emission technology vendors
- Require a preliminary description of ZECMS concept and strategies
- Must contain a sound financial feasibility/business plan and an estimate on potential environmental benefits.

Submittals Evaluation



All submittals will be evaluated by the joint project management team, including subject matter experts through the USC Keston Institute for Public Finance and Infrastructure Policy

Tentative RFQ Schedule



- Release of RFQ: April 21, 2009
- Pre-Submittal Conference: April 30, 2009
- Submittals Due: 1st or 2nd week of June, 2009
- Evaluation Complete in Summer 2009

Proposed Next Steps



- A detailed Request for Proposals (RFP) to design, build and operate a ZECMS might be issued by ACTA
- Only qualified teams would be invited to submit proposals
- The successful proposer would have to execute a contract committing to design, build and operate the system for the proposed price.
